We got the rigging right this time, and with her new paint, *Egret* is beautiful.

He and I, paddling together, have learned that we can get **Egret** away from her mooring, which is close in-shore, and out where there is room to sail. Jason's girlfriend, Sanna, and my wife, Nora, are necessary as crew. Even though we cherish history, the addition of a modern engine some days seems enticing.

Since going in the water, *Egret* has been sailed seven times (twice a month). It is so good to see that she is sailing regularly again, even without a dock. Hooray!

On January 13, Jason and I did a successful silent auction sail. The four people we took sailing were a delight. I am proud and happy to announce that Jason was approved to sail *Egret* independently.

The saga of the hurricane-Irma-damaged dock continues. There was another meeting with our consultant on the dock replacement issue. Present were Katrina, Alyn, John Pal, Lee, Mike Chapman, Renny Young, and me. The consultant strongly recommended that we rebuild on the existing pilings, to minimize costs and time of reconstruction. An examination of the pilings by a diver recommended by Board member Debra Wellins has confirmed that the existing pilings can support a new dock. That is great news, knowing that a full reconstruction of the dock would exceed \$100,000!

Washington's Birthday Regatta is one of the premier annual events at The Barnacle. John Palenchar was again this year the event planner. Registered boats for the race were split into three categories. Mike Chapman sailed

The News Packet was created to inform members and public about The Barnacle Society, The Barnacle Historic State Park, and events and activities there. It's published quarterly by The Barnacle Society as part of its continuing program to support and preserve the home of Commodore Ralph Middleton Munroe. The News Packet represents the method of mail and news delivery before the turn of the 20th century. A small boat sailed to Fowey Rocks Light and received a "packet" of newspapers and mail from passing coastal sailing ships bound for Key West or Jacksonville.
